

Giro d'Italia Monte Ologno

MEDIUM

From Lake Maggiore to the foot of Monte Ologno, where the 18th Melide-Verbania stage of the **98th** professional **Giro d'Italia** passed through in 2015, the climb is considered to be of the first category with its average gradient of 9% over 10 km. On the ramps to Monte Ologno, **Alberto Contador** (Giro pink jersey) attacked his closest pursuers (Landa and Aru), inflicting a 1'10'' gap on them. The stage was won by **Philippe Gilbert**, who arrived solo at the finish line in Pallanza.

To tackle another beautiful climb made famous by the passage of the 2015 Giro d'Italia, you start from the right bank of the **San Bernardino** Creek, precisely from the parking lot in front of the Multifunctional Event Center **"il Maggiore"** in **Intra**.

After the bridge, you descend onto the traffic circle in front of Palazzo Flaim, the seat of the Verbania City Council. Continue on Lungolago Felice Cavallotti promenade in Intra, before the historic pier, until you cross the **San Giovanni** (hence the toponym "Intra": between two streams). From here on, pedal close to **Lake Maggiore**, with consistently mild weather favouring winter rides. The towns touched before reaching the start of the actual climb are **Ghiffa** and **Oggebbio**, with a variation in gradient (in the 3-4% range) between Oggebbio and **Cannero**.

Once in Cannero, near the bus stop, the start of the climb to **Trarego Viggiona** is on the left. It has a sharp curve and a gradient of more than 12%.

In this first 500 m, there is a peak of 13% gradient. Fear not, for the good stuff is yet to come! After about 1.3 km, those who have haughtily snubbed the 39/26 will regret not having the 28. But cheer up! Those still have some strength left to look around can enjoy enchanting views of Lake Maggiore, from the lake inlet below to the famous "**Castles of Cannero or the Malpaga**." Scenic digressions aside, the climb continues, passing through the many "**contrade**" that characterized Trarego Viggiona as a "**tourist municipality**."

The gradients fluctuate around 12% with peaks of 14%, then stabilize at around 9% until the junction for Alpe Colle in the locality of **Cheglio**, a real crossroads with a map board. From here, you turn right in Colle's direction.

The first kilometre is the most challenging, with the gradient reaching up to 16%. In its favour is that it runs in a tree-lined tunnel and is a great comfort on certain scorching summer days.

The actual switchbacks are a dozen, steadily climbing around 9-10%. So up to the "Grotto Monte Carza" (included in the "**Wonderwood**" park, located on the left, in a small clearing, complete with an artificial pond and an adventure park for under 14s and beyond), where the road flattens

out for a few hundred meters, then starts climbing again in a decidedly less claustrophobic and increasingly scenic area.

A few hundred meters from the top of the climb is a fountain dedicated to Mario Pedroni. The top of the hill takes place at the spot that gives the climb its name: **Monte Ologno**, complete with a sign commemorating the historic passage of the **Giro d'Italia**. For the record, it was the **98th edition**, 18th stage Melide (CH)-Verbania, held on Thursday, **May 28, 2015**, with **Philippe Gilbert** winning the stage and **Alberto Contador** winning that year's Giro.

From here, you descend for a little more than a mile to the crossroads of **Sant'Eurosia**, then climb again in Colle's direction. You struggle for a few more minutes before reaching, along a level stretch, the **Linea Cadorna of Verbano** crossroads.

At **Colle**, there is another fountain with consistently fresh water. You then continue on the left in the direction of **Piancavallo**. It is 2 1/2 km with not too steep gradients between 4% and 7%. Monte Rosa makes a unique backdrop for souvenir photos on certain days with clear skies.

The climb ends at an altitude of 1302 m. Then it descends back to **Piancavallo**, with its **Istituto Auxologico Italiano**, with patients from all over Italy, and a good refreshment stop at **La Baita Restaurant**.

Now it's all downhill, almost downhill.

The descent on **Manegra** has an extensive roadway and curves, where considerable speeds are reached; since there is no shortage of traffic, caution is recommended.

Having reached the end of the beautiful descent and passed the small town, you return to climb towards **Pian del Sole**; it is the last climb of the day, just over 2.5 km, with highs of 9%.

Once over the top, it is all downhill until Verbania. One transit place **Premeno**, **Pian Nava**, **Bée**, **Vignone**, **Arizzano**, and **Zoverallo**.

On reaching **Intra**, you pass over the San Giovanni Creek and, at the traffic circle, continue straight on **Via XXIV Maggio** towards the San Bernardino Creek. You then take **Via Brigata Martiri Valgrande** and, at the **Sant'Anna bridge**, cross over to the other bank, complete with a traffic circle from which you exit onto **Via Olanda** and come to a close at the Piazzale del Maggiore.

TECHNICAL ASPECTS

Loop tour between lake and mid-mountain.

The Cannero-Monte Ologno- Piancavallo is a challenging climb, but it is also rich in satisfaction because of the environment and the views it offers.

A 36/28 is recommended--and a few more.

CRITICAL POINTS.

1. The hardest part is from Cheglio to Mount Carza: 2 kilometres with slopes consistently above double digits.

2. Swift descent from Piancavallo to Manegra: be careful not to overdo it!
